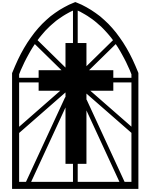

## LOVE SHOWS IT

Dear St. John Saints.

I love you. I do. Yes, I'm saying that because Valentine's Day is coming. And Valentine's Day is a time for expressions of love. Usually, Valentine's Day is thought to be an expression of romantic and affectionate love.

But there is a love that is greater and deeper than that. Consider God's love for us. The Bible is clear that God loves and that God is love. But God's love is not just an affectionate love for us. God's love goes much deeper. God shows love—He doesn't just say it. God shows His love in keeping His promises. He promises to grant you what you need today: food, shelter, water, clothes, family, and friends. If you have these—God has fulfilled His promises to you.

But God's love is also shown to us in mercy and forgiveness. God gave up His most precious and beloved Son to death for you to save you from your sins. The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross for you is the greatest love every. John 3:16 (ESV): "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." God's love is so much more deeper and foundational than a simple expression of affectionate love. God's love is according to His decision and will to love us.

Consider when couples are married. The groom and the bride make vows (promises) to each other. To uphold those promises to be faithful and to love in all situations is a love that goes way beyond affection; it goes to will and choice and decision. Husbands and wives are faithful when they keep their promises made on their wedding day. And if we are honest, we know that spouses might not always feel loving or affectionate. But when we are true to our vows, by choice, by our will, because we once said so, that is love. And from love that is the intent of the will affectionate love is kindled and renewed daily.

This reminds us of and reflects our relationship with God. God loves us by His will and by keeping His vows to us faithfully. And He doesn't just say; He shows love. He puts His love into action by taking care of us and this world every day. God put His love into action when Jesus did the love of the Law for us. Jesus showed us God's love by suffering and dying in our place for sins. God fulfills His promises and will fulfill them when this world ends and He takes us into eternal life with Himself.

We show love for God not by saying so, but by keeping His commands. The summary of the 10 Commandments is love—love for God and love for each other. Love doesn't just say it. Love does it. It shows it by actions. So, I pray that we show each other love by loving each other—really showing love for each other in our actions. And if you want to see what true love is this month as you prepare for Valentine's Day, look to the cross. The cross, where Jesus died for you to save you from your sins—that is true love. True love is sacrificial. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, died to save you. True love shows it. And God shows love for us in Jesus and He continues to show it by His wonderful gifts to us each and every day. First, in the forgiveness of our sins, and then in His blessings to us each and every day.

I love you. But more than that—so much more—God loves you—and He shows you in Jesus.

## HEALTHY HABITS:

### OH NO! NOT THAT STUFF AGAIN!

Yes, it's true. The H3N2 is back with a vengeance. Nebraska is in the red alert zone for the flu. (Flu refers to respiratory influenza, not stomach upsets.) This year's flu vaccine is only about 32% effective. However, if you got a flu shot and you get the flu, you should get a lighter case than if you didn't get the shot. Symptoms include fever ☐, chills, headache ☐, muscle aches, fatigue, runny nose or nasal congestion ☐, sore throat and cough. The symptoms of a cold come on slowly while the flu hits suddenly. The most vulnerable people are young children, those over age 65, those with other medical conditions such as heart disease, cancer or diabetes, and those receiving certain medications, such as chemotherapy.

**What can you do?** Avoid crowds and especially people with any symptoms. Wash, wash, wash your hands! Wash them as soon as you return home from anywhere. Stay home if you are sick. You are able to pass the virus from about 24 hours before you have symptoms until at least 24 hours after you are fever free. This means no fever without the help of medicine. Cover your cough but not with your hand. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue, discard it and go wash your hands. Or cough into the crook of your elbow. If you cover your mouth with your hands and then touch anything, or shake hands with someone, your germs are now on them. No one wants your germs any more than you want theirs. **REMEMBER:** Elbows up to cover those coughs. Stay healthy.

Lent will begin this month. Ash Wednesday is February 14th. This season we will consider the wisdom and help we have in suffering from ... The Book of Job: Blessed Be the Name of the Lord! One of the Bible's greatest wisdom books is the book of Job. This Lent we will explore this magnificent composition that is numbered among the greatest literature of all time. The sermon themes will help us dig deeply into Job's central message and supporting truths.

We all suffer—personally and privately. We also suffer in more public ways. A husband loses a job. A child gets divorced. A parent dies. And now, thanks to the media, we are able to see and experience more and more of the world's catastrophes and suffering. We need the book of Job, now, more than ever.

Martin Luther asserted that "Job is magnificent and sublime as no book of Scripture." Others have called Job "the Shakespeare of the Bible." The early Christian scholar Jerome perhaps put it best when he called the book of Job an "eel," since the more one tries to contain it, the slipperier it becomes! The purpose of our Lenten emphasis is to learn how to apply Job to our lives so that the book becomes less like an eel and more like a loving companion through life's dark valleys. Preaching plans are as follows:

Lent 1 Sweet Surrender (Job 1:13–21)

Lent 2 Learning to Lament (Job 3:1–26)

Lent 3 It Is Enough (Job 14:1–14)

Lent 4 Understanding How It All Works Together (Job 23:1–17)

Lent 5 God Speaks in the Storm (Job 38:1–11)

Maundy Thursday On Earth Is Not His Equal! (Job 41:20–34)

Good Friday Tearing Down the Spite House (Job 42:7–9)

The Resurrection of Our Lord I Know That My Redeemer Lives! (Job 19:23–26)

Job's most famous statement appears in 19:25, "I know that my Redeemer lives." Christ is alive. He has conquered death and the grave. His word is sufficient. His grace is enough. His love brings comfort and healing. And this Lent these gifts come to us through the book of Job.

### **MEN'S BIBLE STUDY**

The St. John Men's Bible Study group continues with a Martin Luther based video series, "A Man Named Martin". The men will begin the second part of this historical, interesting series: "Part II - The Moment". Martin Luther's Spirit-inspired grasp of justification through faith was the cornerstone of the Reformation. This second part of the series examines the errant teachings and wayward traditions of the Late Medieval Church that eventually sparked the Protestant Reformation, a theological overhaul set in motion most notably by Martin Luther's nailing of the 95 Theses to the church door at Wittenberg.

As a follow-up Bible study to the first, "A Man Named Martin-Part 1: The Man", this three-session Bible study takes a close look at the widespread teachings of the late Medieval Church that were superfluous to the Bible or not scripturally grounded. Among them were purgatory, penance, celibacy, prayers for the dead, transubstantiation, the treasury of merits of Christ, devotion to Mary and the rosary, the institution of the papacy, and the one most often linked to the Reformation: the sale of indulgences. The men's group meets at 7:00 p.m. each 2nd Tuesday of the month. Our door is always open to new members, with guests equally welcomed. See you guys on Tuesday, February 13!

### **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

From Diane Hayes - wife of Pastor Joshua Hayes

Sausage Barley Soup

1 lb. Italian sausage

1 small onion, chopped

1 clove garlic, minced ( I use dried, jarred garlic)

2 -3 carrots, sliced

2-3 celery ribs, sliced

48 oz. low-sodium chicken broth/stock

1 cp. pearled barley \*

Brown sausage in large pan. Add onion and garlic and cook until onions begin to soften. Add carrots and celery and cook briefly. Transfer this to slow cooker. Add remaining ingredients and cook on low, 4-6 hours.

\*If you use Instant Pearled Barley, add during the last hour of cooking!
